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1. Scope

This addendum applies until further notice.

Unless covered in this addendum, our normal behaviour policy continues to apply.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes.

We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and students.

2. Expectations for pupils in school

When students are in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact Mrs Lindsay Munro, Deputy Headteacher if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them.

- Students must follow all routines for arriving or leaving the school, including times, location and distancing
- Hygiene rules must be followed, such as handwashing and sanitising
- Students must follow all guidance for socialising during non-contact times, such as breaks and lunch, including who pupils can socialise with, location and distancing guidelines.
- Students must follow the rules regarding moving around the school (e.g. one-way systems, out of bounds areas, queuing)
- Students must follow the guidance of 'catch it, bin it, kill it'
- Students must tell an adult immediately if they are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus
- Students must not share any equipment or other items, including drinking bottles
- Students must follow the rules regarding the use of toilets and follow the hygiene guidance
- Students must not cough or spit at or towards any other person

2a. Expectations for pupils at home

Remote learning rules

If students are not in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below.

- Students should:
- Complete work to the deadline set by teachers, or inform their teacher if they are having difficulty
- Seek help if they need it, from teachers or teaching assistants

- Alert teachers if they're not able to complete work
- Use proper online conduct, such as using appropriate language in messages

Dealing with problems

If there are any problems with students adhering to rules around remote learning, including if they don't engage with the remote learning set for them, we will first get in touch with parents/carers to identify any issues or barriers to learning and seek to address them.

Sanctions for not following rules

If students fail to follow these rules, we will continue to apply behaviour points using Classcharts and seek to educate students on the importance of these rules. Verbal warnings will be given and parents/carers contacted. We recognise that adjustment to these new rules may result in accidental rule breaking initially. Our approach to this will be educative to ensure the health and safety of all members of our community.

However, if the behaviour is continually repeated, or is deemed purposeful and/or puts the health and safety of other students and staff at risk, parents will be contacted immediately to discuss to ensure the safety of other members of the school community.

3. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the Linsay Munro, Deputy Head as guidance from the local authority or Department for Education is updated. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
